For more than 25 years Motiv8 has been unlocking brighter futures for young people.

Working across Portsmouth, Havant, Gosport and Fareham we recognise that there are many factors which can lead to instability at home, a person needing support around their emotional health or wellbeing, or place young people and their families at increased risk of becoming involved in anti-social behaviour or crime.

In 2023/2024 we have continued to take a place led and person-centred approach, building on strengths, and providing positive 'life chances' which help all who we work with to thrive.

A NOTE FROM OUR NEW CEO



KIRSTY ROBERTSON CEO, MOTIV8

Here at Motiv8, we're passionate about creating the conditions to enable young people and families to thrive.

Throughout 2023/2024 Motiv8 has reflected on the current challenges that young people, families and communities face. We are experiencing a worsening crisis regarding young people's mental health, increasing numbers missing from education, increasing exploitation of young people, high number of families living in poverty and specialist services are at capacity. Young people are falling through the net and are often only able to access support at point of crisis; at which point it takes longer to turn things around.

The question we continue to ask is what can we do to support this when the challenge is becoming more complex and number in need are rising at rates we haven't seen at any point in our 25 year history. The answer however is to double down on what makes Motiv8 special. The range of our offer and the trust that defines the work of our amazing youth workers.

We want to provide the right support, at the right time. This means reaching young people and families earlier to prevent problems from escalating. It means remaining focused locally and being a permanent presence in our communities, acting as the glue that binds services and people together. It means building trusted relationships, offering person-centred approaches and helping young people to feel connected with a sense of belonging. It means providing safe spaces to engage where support can be accessed without fear of being stigmatised.

In this report you will find lots of examples of how we do this. 23/24 has been a brilliant year. A year of change, but also one of huge opportunity. With growing need we have seen our impact grow also and while challenges remain we believe we face then from an incrediblu strong position. Not least thanks to the people of Motiv8, our staff and volunteers.

Together, I am confident we can bring about lasting change.

HOW HAVE WE ACHIEVED OUR AIMS?



We have increased access by investing in two new youth hub spaces. Taken on long term leases, these will enable young people to access immediate support and warm safe spaces when they need it within their communities.



We've increased our **collaborative projects**, bringing together the collective resources, opportunities, expertise of partner networks to offer the most effective skills development and support early emotional well being help.



We have brought together a **dedicated Family Support Team** who can oversee and coordinate an integrated
'Team Around the Family' (TAF) to ensure the best
possible outcome for those vulnerable families supported.



Through targeted group work we can provide alternative education life skils pathways for young people struggling in or excluded from school. Aspirational by nature we offer business discovery days and mentoring so all can achieve.



Diversifying our income streams, we have signed new **corporate partnership agreements** with four local business partners, and have entered in to support arrangements with a further six, offering gifts of money, opportunity, and time.



Furthering our commitment to sharing power with young people, we have appointed a new Youth Voice, Influence, and Participation Lead working across all teams. This new post will recruit twelve Motiv8 Youth Advisers, a paid role, to represent their peers and inform our practice.

A WARM WELCOME

Increasingly, self reporting shows that our Hubs are the only opportunity young people have for emotional or creative expression, as well as to develop creative skills. For many young people, these hubs are the only safe spaces they feel able to confidently express themselves and develop positively within their communities.

A WARM, SAFE SPACE

Our provision is always place based, community led, and accessible for vulnerable young people living in places of high deprivation. Many are struggling to meet energy and heating costs at home so we ensure they have access to inviting, safe and warm spaces to thrive.

A WARM MEAL

We are committed to providing continued access to free, warm food in all of our activities - from hub sessions through one-to-one mentoring. We also seek to offer and embed practical support for families around cooking, access to food, as well as advice and guidance for addressing financial hardship.

The Challenges

Children, young people, and families are struggling with the cost of living and inflation, with more and more reaching out for our support than ever before.

With 90% of our service users now defining as being from socio-economic disadvantage, we are delivering a 21% increase direct provision. Offering foundations, flexibility, and fun to those we support has never been of greater importance.



Increasing safeguarding concerns

We have seen a year on year trend of rising safeguarding concerns - up 27% in 23/24. A third of all reported safeguarding concerns were violence related with other key themes being self-harm, criminal exploitation, substance misuse, and instability at home. With safeguarding reports increasing both in our family support and community provision it is critical that we can offer a wide range of interventions and signpost to further support to avoid any young person 'slipping through the net'.

Increasing levels of young people with serious and complex vulnerabilities

Young people are presenting in our provision with significant, complex, and often overlapping mental health concerns. This can stem from exploitation, extreme bullying, neurodiversity, neglect and violence in the home. Understandably as well as these concerns taking longer to support, this places a heavier personal toll on the youth workers supporting them. Motiv8 has implemented a new programme of 'trauma informed' supervisions and training to support, sessional, and youth workers. Alongside this, the number of young people attending multiple Motiv8 sessions for access to food, warmth, digital equipment for schools, or seeking friendships has grown, as we support families working hard to make life easier at home.

The Cost of Living crisis has led to increasing numbers of young people needing more immediate support.

Our current mentoring and listening services are full and our waiting lists are so busy they are closed with a 4 - 9 month wait for long-term support. We are implementing new early help well-being sessions and more Youth Hubs that meet immediate needs such as hunger and social isolation, digital poverty and anxiety.

There has been a 48% increase in referrals to Motiv8 this year compared to 2022/23 as partners turn to us with their requests for early help support. Increasingly Motiv8 plays a bridging role for those who access NHS or other Mental Health Supports, helping young people and their families put in to practice and embed the techniques and coping strategies that unlock resilience.



FINANCIAL STABILITY

During the last three years, income has grown however our expenditure has also increased largely driven by staff costs with an increased headcount to manage the ever increasing capacity of need as well as a higher cost of living increase than initially anticipated.

Other significant increases are related to activities with inflation driving up costs, youth hubs attracting more young people and greater spend on food with Motiv8 committed to providing access to free food at our hub sessions during the cost of living crisis. We also saw increased costs associated and utilities costs.

The strength of Motiv8 comes from its people and the trusted, empowering relationships our professional teams cultivate with those young people and families they are committed to helping.

What sits behind this are the many aspects of our delivery, that we now call our '8 Strands'.

The Strands offer a simplified and compelling overview of our range while also demonstrating the many ways people can access Motiv8, and begin their journey toward a brighter future.

Understanding the adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) they have faced and building achievable alternative pathways our 'Futures' programme offers hope to young people who may be often missed or otherwise slip through the safety net.

In partnership with Barnardo's, and generously supported by CO-OP, over 12 weeks we worked with 113 young people to understand the barriers they face accessing support and services.

Focused on young people shaping change in their own words, Motiv8 Youth Advisors then led a cross city project to design services that would improve life chances and social mobility. They indicated that the top three services they wanted to see were Wellbeing Drop ins, Youth Mentoring outside of Schools and 'Healthy Living, Cooking Hubs'. HOLIDAY FUN!

Alongside our ongoing term time and open access Youth Hubs, drop ins, and skills sessions in 2023, Motiv8 has continued to offer Holiday Activities and Food (HAF), Summer Passport, and an active programme in each of the school holidays

Across the Summer, Winter and Easter breaks we have delivered 2250 free places on exciting activities across Gosport, Havant, and Portsmouth. Through sustainability sessions, music days, BMX rides, Enterprise workshops, mindfulness, cooking classes and much more these are chances to build vital soft skills, develop friendships, and grow in confidence outside of school while having fun.

Furthering our Three Warms approach, We ensured every young person is provided with healthy food and can access additional support and guidance as require and the trusted relationships start to be created.

Transformation



CUMBERLAND GATE

Since taking on our new base in Portsmouth in 2023 we have been committed to transforming what was once a conventional business unit into a dedicated multi youth community facility. With the wonderful support of our corporate partner Mountjoy, a local building maintenance and facilities management company, and their supply chain we have brought to life our Fratton hub drawing on youth voice

throughout.

With activities already taking place each and every day we now have a dedicated young person kitchen providing warm meals and cookery skills to those without access to this anywhere else, private, confidential 1-2-1 mentoring spaces increasing our flexibility, a sound proof sensory space to support emotional well-being drop ins and an improved activity space allowing for greater variety in our programmes.

A HOME FOR HAVANT

In a transformational move for our Havant team, we began taking over the whole of the ground floor at 'The Hub' on Leigh Park High Street. In a major move for an area identified by 'Local Trust' as one of six most 'left behind' places in the South East, we are proud to make this vital, long-term, 10 year commitment.

Located in the centre of the town, this gives us access to dedicated 1:2:1 spaces, two delivery areas, staff space (previously we had 10 people sharing a room for 2 - see the picture to the left!) and an exciting urban outdoor garden space young people can cultivate.



DIGITAL DEVELOPMENT

At the heart of our digital development this year has been Outcome Star. An integrated, evidence based tool for supporting and monitoring change, this year we have rolled out extensive training to embed this in all our practice. The star helps young people consider relation to all aspects of their life and marks an important moment in how we enabling all to more effectively highlight the distance traveled as part of Motiv8's intervention and celebrate success.

We have also made further investments in our digital footprint moving all referral, consent, and feedback forms online, as well as integrating our safeguarding and incident reporting to our cloud based content management platform. Further investment will come next year with a new fundraising CRM, a new website, and as we continue towards securing cyber essentials.

The Big Give 2023



In 2023, MOTIV8 took part in the annual 'Big Give' Christmas Challenge. A double up matching campaign, this was a chance to raise essential unrestricted funding for young people and families



With increasing demand for our services, we knew we needed to aim bigger than previous years, setting our target at £8,000 to be doubled to £16,000 if successful. Twice the previous years target.



The 2023 Big Give Christmas Challenge was one of the most successful campaigns we have ever run. We exceeded our target by an astonishing amount in the first 12 hours alone, raising £27,739 - 173% of our target!


Our response to each safeguarding concern takes an average of 2.5 hours.
